

Maths

During the Autumn term children will consolidate their learning from FS2 before confidently moving on to more tricky concepts.

The areas of maths we will cover are: Number: Place Value (within 10 and 20). Addition and Subtraction (within 10). Geometry: Shape.

At St John's we follow the White Rose schemes of learning for maths and teach using a mastery approach.

Support children at home by involving them in everyday maths tasks like shopping and cooking, talk about days of the week, months of the year and times of the day you complete certain activities.

English

Children will develop their descriptive writing by looking at a number of different narrative texts including 'Perfectly Norman'. The children will also learn a range of poetry through the poetry basket. Children will also write a focused piece called 'Firework Night'.

Daily phonics teaching and reading sessions will enable children to read and spell confidently. Handwriting sessions will take place three times a week, enabling children to write legibly and fluently using a pre-cursive handwriting style.

Please aim to read with your child five times a week and record this in their reading records. Reading books will be changed by class teachers on a Thursday. Children will take home a fully decodable reading book until their phonics knowledge is secure, this is to support your child in applying their increasing phonics knowledge and is in line with current DfE guidance.

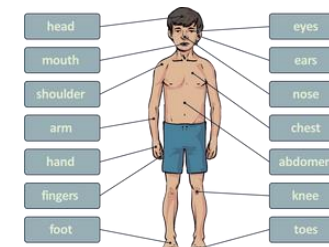
